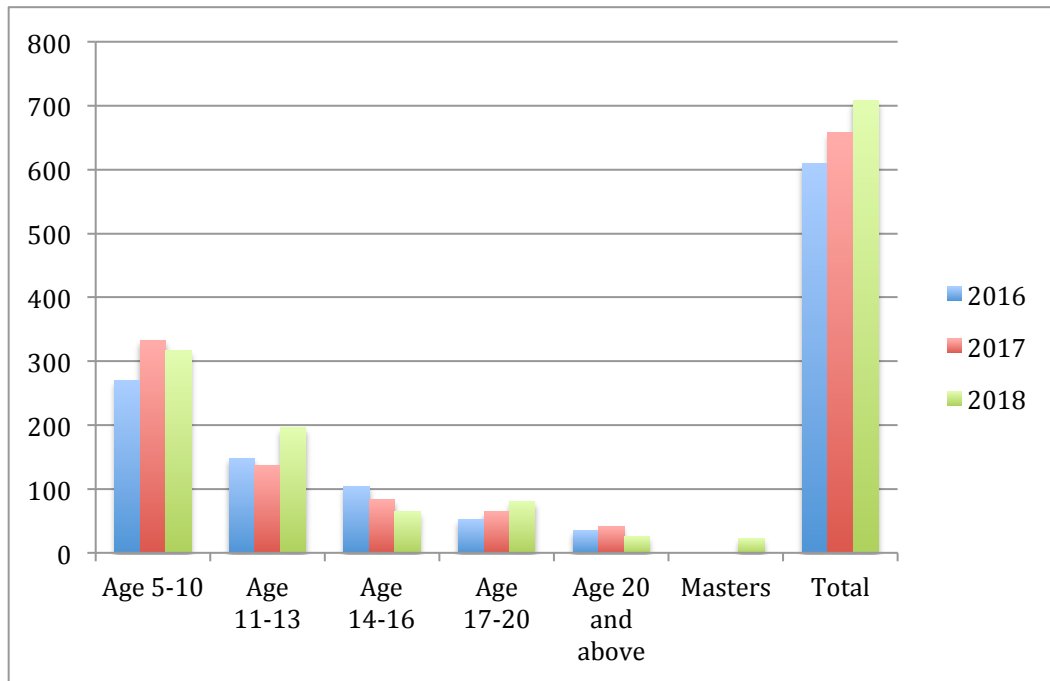

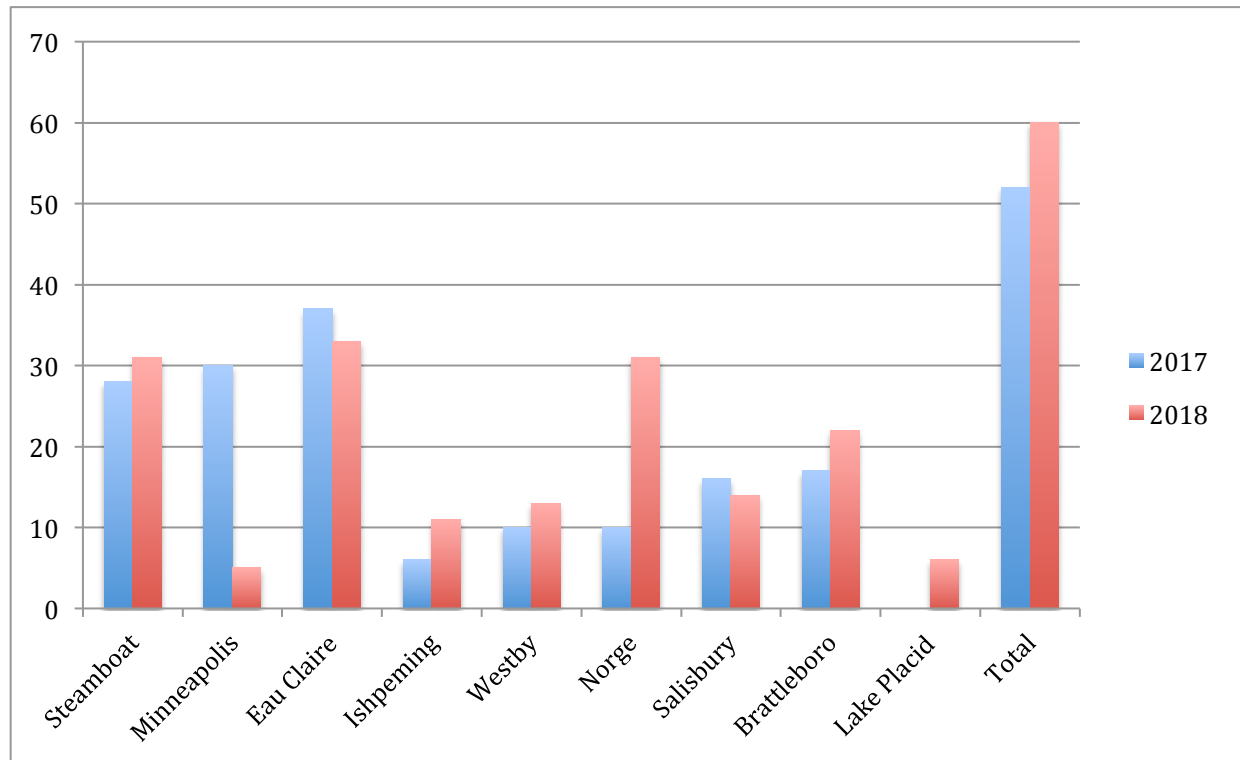

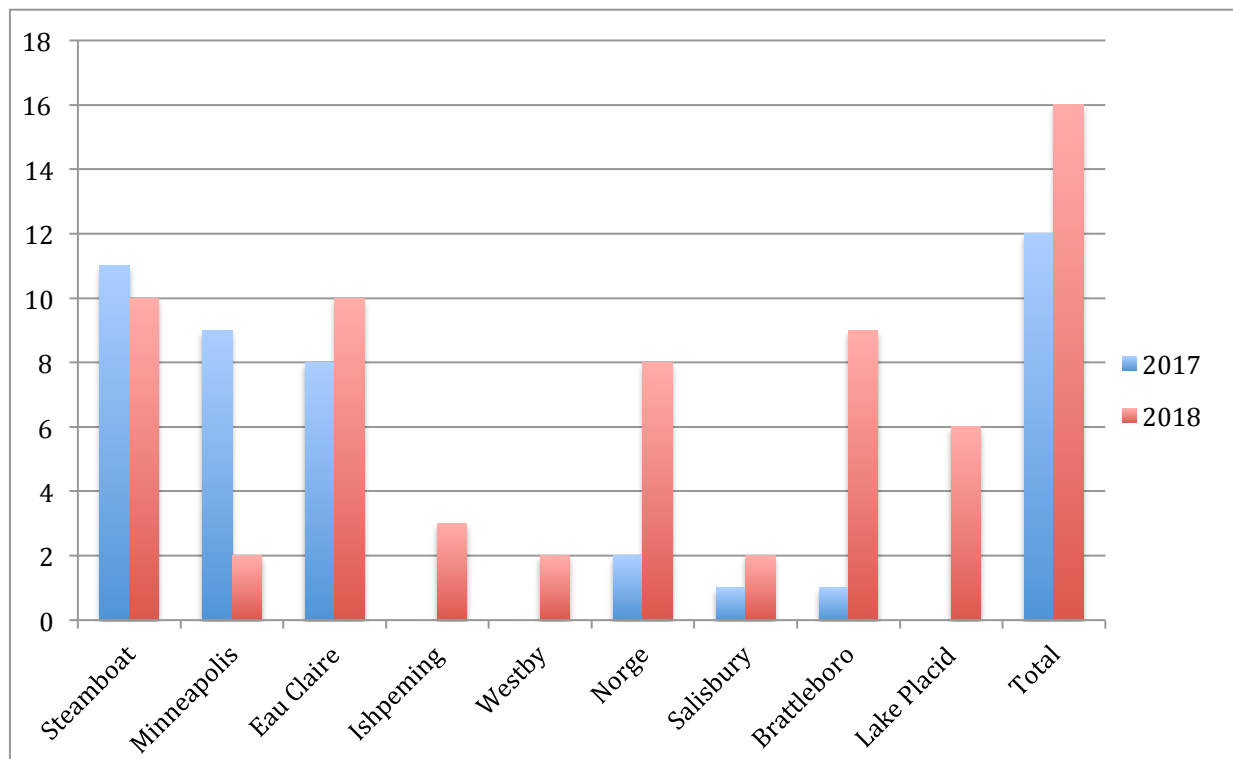

Facility Updates/Upgrades:

- Andover
 - Had survey of site done
 - Working with proctor on a plan to upgrade facilities
- Blackhawk
 - Club is getting a cell tower and part of revenue will hopefully be earmarked for new plastic on the 30 and 10 meter
- Brattleboro:
 - Worked with Vermont Academy and was able to utilize their small hills for a new junior program
 - Still working with Memorial Park on getting old hills going again
- Cameron
 - Looking at new sites to build more permanent small hills
- Coleraine:
 - The club continues to seeking funds to put grade boards on the landing hill of the 70 meter so that they can host competitions again
 - Rebuilt their 15 meter
- Cooper Peak
 - Bill with funding did not pass but the plan is to bring it up again next year
- Eau Claire:
 - New Pump house at Silver Mine
 - Part way done with new 55 meter and hope to be completed by the end of the summer
- Gunstock:

- Met with State to find out what grants might be available to help rebuild the jump. There are already plans for a new 20 meter, just need the funds to do it
- Ishpeming:
 - Cleared the 60 meter landing hill this past summer and hope to hold a 60 meter competition in the coming year
- Lebanon:
 - Installed steel tracks on the 48 meter and the 25 meter
 - Hoping to re-profile the landing hills
- Minneapolis:
 - Have the plastic to finish the 30 meter and hope to be up and running this summer
- Nansen/Berlin:
 - Took survey points and put them into Matt Gundry's program to create a profile
 - Became part of the Nansen Ski Club to help move efforts forward
 - Working on a plan to raise the funds to make necessary upgrades to hold an event
- ORDA:
 - Plans to install a new porcelain/ice track in September/October on HS100, HS135
 - Moving forward with 60 meter in 2019
- Salisbury:
 - Planning on constructing a snow cat building and getting a new cat
 - Possibly steel tracks and plastic after that
